# English – language, literatures and cultures in a global context.

The importance of English and its literatures and cultures has surged once again in our contemporary globalized world. For centuries, English has been central to worldwide communication, making globalization possible in the first place. Today it continues to shape the processes of exchange and communication in the various Anglophone regions of the world.

The Master's programme Intercultural Anglophone Studies (MAIAS) offered by the University of Bayreuth engages this phenomenon, in all its manifold historical and contemporary manifestations. The research-oriented English/ American Studies degree programme deals in particular with intercultural and transcultural questions, and examines the cultural significance of a wide variety of forms of expression, in literature, film, theatre, and music, including forms of popular culture.

### Study in close contact with research.

At the University of Bayreuth, you will encounter a small, research-oriented Master's programme with an excellent staff-student ratio, and exciting topics from which you can freely choose your own area of focus, such as: British, American and African literatures and cultures; post-colonial and diaspora studies; ecocriticism; gender studies; literature and media. English linguistics covers the following areas: language, cognition and culture; diversity of the English language in its cultural environments; and corpus linguistics. You will benefit from ideal conditions to expand and improve your analytical and methodological skills, and, of course, to conduct independent research. The Master's programme is particularly attractive due to its unique integration into Anglophone and interdisciplinary research areas, such as American Studies and African Studies.



MAIAS deals with complex linguistic, literary and cultural topics from different perspectives, with special emphasis on intercultural and transcultural issues. At the end of their studies, students work independently on a comprehensive thesis to demonstrate their competencies.

#### Exciting prospects in science and business.

After successfully completing your Master's degree, you are well prepared for an academic career in research and teaching. For example, you can do your doctorate at the University of Bayreuth within the framework of the International Doctoral Program Cultural Encounters, or the Bayreuth International Graduate School of African Studies. With the gualifications and the competences you have acquired, you can also look forward to exciting prospects in a wide variety of sectors and institutions, such as media and journalism, publishing, new media, international cultural institutions, cultural management, intercultural consulting, services, and trade. Or you can pursue a career in the increasingly important forums of intercultural exchange, on which graduates of the Intercultural Anglophone Studies Master's programme are in great demand.
